

## The “Least Worst” Is Not Convincing

Explaining party politics in its structure and context refers to something that includes power and money. The power that the ruling class exercises through its “stolen/usurped/plundered money” in a frivolous manner through surplus value and the exploitation of workers, implies the perpetuation of a “bankrupt system” from a human, social, moral and ethical point of view. Power means giving orders and commanding in an irresponsible and unethical way and not being held accountable for it, that is, it corresponds to the commission of reckless and irrational acts that reflect a total environmental and organic imbalance. In this way, these people commit crimes against humanity and literally do not pay for the harm they do. Most Brazilian politicians defend policies that will benefit the class that finances them. Yes! Its ideology has given us unemployment, informality, precariousness, violence, crime and lack of access to basic social services that impede the generation of opportunities and human development. The paths taken show that many of the population’s problems have not been resolved, and the individualistic, consumerist and egocentric perspective of life remains.

The liberal-democratic regime in Brazil has allowed the emergence of certain aberrations, “the PT had to stop being a PT supporter”, referring to the expression of Arcary, by distancing itself from popular and labor movements, in contrast to its “opening of legs” to national and international elites who act in defense of their various assets [2]. According to data from the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE) (2022), Brazil has a GDP per capita (per person) of over 47 thousand reais, however, we have a minimum wage of 1412 reais. And the question that begs to be asked: Where are the more than 45 thousand reais missing? Concentrated in the hands of millionaires and billionaires who currently total around 60 people, according to information from

UOL (2024). Of this amount, little is allocated to essential public services for the population, although it is useful to feed the futile and despicable life led by this minority of the population that seems to care little about social problems. None of these billionaires left the favela and succeeded in life; they are all heirs and invest their large “cash” in financial/speculative capital that does not generate jobs for the people; quite the opposite, it only brings chaos and insecurity to the nation. In this sense, it is necessary to decentralize this income so that it can be invested in public and social policies that can build a fair and democratic society, through a proposal of opportunities for the population. The unbalanced and irrational narrative has always accompanied Bolsonaro “bozo-boçalnaro” during his strange, controversial and boring political trajectory, enriching himself through public coffers and the “sweat of the worker”. According to Bugalho “it would not be the political class that corrupts the system, but an exclusionary system that corrupts people” [3]. His speech transcends the barriers of common sense by emphasizing his “specialty in killing”, taking over Brazil through the Trumpist/racist/war-mongering/elitist/xenophobic/ultranationalist/capitalist/neoliberal/destructive American influence that is an enemy of humanity. Bolsonaro is a “child of the military dictatorship”, because he knows how to enjoy his privileges that he enjoys at the expense of the working people, fulfilling his role as a “bacon-brained” politician who is bankrolled by the “rotten and parasitic” bourgeoisie.

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
